COMPREHENION

1. a) Give the full names of the characters present .
Zach Willet – Amy Stack
b) Give the full name of one of the characters mentioned.
Ted Cartwright
2. When exactly does the scene take place ? (10 words maximum)
It takes place on a Tuesday at five o'clock in the afternoon.
3. a) Focus on the passage from line 1 down to line 24 : where exactly are the characters ? (10 words max.)
They are in the sales office of the Cartwright Town Houses Corporation.
b) Focus on the passage from line 37 down to line 44 : where are they ? (10 words max.)
They are in a house (for sale) / in a four-story town house for sale / at 8 Pawnee Avenue.
c) How do they go from one place to another ? (5 to 10 words)
They go from one place to another on foot / They walk.
d) Justify your answer in 3.c by quoting from the text.
Line 34-35. "She walked a few steps more".
e) What do they go the second place for ? (10 words max.)
They go to the second place to visit it.
f) Characterize the second place with four adjectives of your own.
Large – big – comfortable – luxurious – high-tech – well-appointed – fully equipped – ultra modern, ...

Focus on the female character.

4. a) Give her boss's full name. What is her job ? What does it consist in ? (30 words max.)
She works for Ted Cartwright as a sales clerk. Her job consists in showing potential buyers round houses.
b) What is she about to do at the beginning of the text ? (10 words max.)
She is about to leave / go back home / close down for the day.
c) What does she do instead ? (10 words max.)
She agrees to show Zach the house.
d) What does it reveal about her ? (5 to 10 words max.)
She cares for her job / She is really professional / She is dedicated to her job / She is really committed into her job.
e) Quote one element from the text to support your answer in 4.d.
Line 17. "I'll be glad to take you over" / Line 28. "she said proudly"
f) Focus on the passage from line 34 down to line 46
Choose the adjective that best applies to her.
She is : - sensitive
- surprised
- convincing
- rude
- indifferent

g) Justify your answer in 4.f by quoting three elements from the passage.

the house / the house he has just visited / the house at number 8.

b) Line 46. What does “take” mean for the female character ?

It means buy.

c) Justify your answer in 6.b by quoting one element from the text.

Line 47. “Are you prepared to make a deposit now ?”

d) Line 46. What does “take” mean for the male character ?

It means get for free.

e) Justify your answer in 6.d by quoting from the text.

Line 48. “Didn’t Ted Cartwright tell you that he’s giving me this unit ?”

7. Account for your answer in 6.d using elements from the whole text. (20 to 25 words)

Zach thinks he can get the house for free because he saved Ted’s life in the past and Ted owes him a favour.
